## **Comments:**

No. Lowering the limit will only be effective if you follow up with enforcement. Unless people are hit in the wallet, nothing will change and it will cost money for nothing. You have lowered the limit on other roads. Have residents noticed a difference? Have the police laid any traffic act charges? You know as well as I do that speeders don't look at signs. I agree that something needs to be done but simply changing the speed limit will not make any difference.

No. Reducing speed limit is only going to effect local traffic and do nothing to reduce speeders. Get some law enforcement to do radar (not at 12 in the afternoon either)

No. There is no sense changing the speed limit because some people speed on Derland Rd anyway. So it does not matter if the speed limit is 50 or 60 people will still drive 80

No. Post more speed limit signage

Yes. We live @ 255 where there is a flat straight section close to where the flashing speed sign was installed earlier this summer. We often see and hear people travelling at excess speed in front of our home. How about installing speed bumps?

Yes. Estimated average speed 70 - reducing to 50 will have no effect. Zero enforcement by OPP. Trucks, school buses, garbage trucks constantly speed. 50% personal vehicles well over current limit, tailgating by speeding drivers is constant.

Someone is going to get hurt eventually.

Yes. Setting the speed limit is irrelevant unless it is enforced. Many cars fly by the flat area (the mid 200's) especially just before 8am - regardless if the kids are out at the bus stops. We need more police presence.

Yes. West end of Derland is 5 - should be enforced.

Yes. Feel unsafe walking along roadway at current speed. More housing, more traffic since building here in 1997. Derland has many blind spots due to hills, corners. Thanks for painting the white stop strip at Corbeil road intersection. Currently a lot of traffic is speeding.

Yes. Lowering the speed limit won't change anything unless it is enforced. We often see cars in excess of 80km/hr along our stretch - valley near pipeline.

Yes. I live just before the 4 lane hwy on Derland and find the traffic is too fast. Especially walking on the road with my grandchildren in a stroller.

Yes. Great idea!

Yes. Traffic is too fast - lots of walkers and cyclists in the area. Road is too narrow for fast traffic.

Yes. Speeding on Derland has been an issue for years. In addition to a speed reduction, I would like to see increased police presence/enforcement.

Yes. As a parent with 2 children we are terrified by the speed @ which vehicles travel. It would be nice to have something more to enforce the posted speed!

Yes. People travel well over 60km/hr limit.

## Yes. This is badly needed.

Yes. Also reqest patrolling by OPP occasionally to enforce.

Yes. People go way too fast down Derland Rd, so hopefully a speed reduction would help.

Yes. The section of road west Derland rd that is already at 50 km/hr should be reduced to 40 km/hr as the houses are closer together and there are lots of blind spots/winding roads/hills. The use of those digital speed signs would be helpful to slow drivers down, as well as an increased OPP presence.

Yes. I don't believe that lowering the speed limit will be effective unless police presence is in effect.

Yes. We walk our dog daily on Derland rd and feel very unsafe. Also pulling out of our driveway is very dangerous with hills on both sides, we have had many close calls in the last 5 years we do back into driveway for safety reasons.
