Re: Special Council Meeting February 4th

I wish to submit the following questions for discussion at the meeting with the Ministry of Natural Resources Land Claims and Treaties Division concerning the Algonquin Land Claim.

My questions are as follows:

- The current proposal is to build a 137 acre subdivision on Parcel 302B, which consists entirely of granite, one of the hardest rock types on the planet! How will water be drawn for the subdivision and, in the absence of a sewer system, how will effluent be disposed of?
- As mentioned in my previous letter dated November 2020, a copy of which is at the East Ferris office, parcel 302B comprises the entirety of Forest Lane which six property owners must use to access their homes and cottages. They also must seek right-of-way over my property to access their homes. Are you able to put a stop to scouts, working on behalf of the Algonquins, from seeking to pressure me into selling my property?
- How much money are the Algonquins willing to put into rehabilitating inhospitable land into hospitable land even though there is no access to Trout Lake?
- What is the real reason for the Algonquins to claim Parcel 302B?
- Do you foresee any possible future conflict between the current lakefront property owners and the Algonquins?
